To Enforce the Laws

Qualifications for the Presidency

- Article II, Section 1 Presidential
 Qualifications and
 Restrictions
 - At least 35 years old
 - Natural born citizen of US
 - 14 year resident of US
 - Term 4 years (Maximum of 2)



Presidential Roles: Chief of State

- Article II, Section 2 and 3
- Role: The president's role as chief of state is to represent the United States at public events.
 - If otherwise occupied President can send Vice President, Secretary of State, First Lady, Other Cabinet Members, ambassadors, or even past Presidents to represent United States

Presidential Roles: Chief Diplomat

- Role: Being a diplomat involves interacting with leaders from other nations.
- The president is the main creator of foreign policy.
 - Meets with foreign leaders (or works through state department) to accomplish policy goals



Presidential Roles: Chief Executive

- Role: The President controlled agencies have the responsibility and authority to carry out the laws made by congress.
- The president is the head of the Executive Branch, and has highest authority.
 - President makes appointments of people who shares the President's policy goals to different Executive Agencies

Presidential Roles: Chief Legislator

- Role: The President can voice his own ideas and opinions to Congress while they draft legislation.
 - Vice President serves as tie breaking vote in the Senate if needed
- Through speeches and meetings with different Senators the President can help advance legislation

Presidential Roles: Commander in Chief

- Role: The president is the commander in-chief of the U.S. armed forces.
- All military leaders report to and take orders from the president
 - President allowed to commit military with limitations by Congress



Presidential Roles: Chief of Party

- Role: the president helps members of his political party get elected or appointed to office.
- Helps establishes party platforms
 - Helps dictate party's position on different policy issues



Presidential Roles: Chief Citizen

- Role: The moral leader of America. Act in the best interest of the general public.
 - Meant to be a role model and help sway public opinion



Other Environmental Powers Reserved for the President

- The Antiquities Act Allows the president to designates area as protected, can just as easily be revoked
- Executive Orders Directive by the president that instructs an Executive Branch on how to operate. Subject to confines of a law, & judicial review. Can just as easily be overturned
